**Ranking regulations**

Version 1.1

## 1. General provisions.

1.1. The ranking was created to determine the strongest shooters of the Kyrgyz Republic based on the results of several competitions throughout the year. As well as to increase the motivation of shooters to participate in the competitions of the Sniping Federation of the Kyrgyz Republic and to determine the members of national teams for participation in international tournaments;

1.2. Only current members of the Sniping Federation of the Kyrgyz Republic participate in the ranking.

## 2. Basic concepts used in this Regulation.

2.1. FSKR - Public Association of the Sniping Federation of the Kyrgyz Republic;

2.2. ITCC - International T-Class Confederation, founded in 2014, promotes T-Class shooting sport, which is mainly focused on competition with precision weapons systems;

2.3. Standard competition - any competition approved in the FSKR competition calendar, in which there are three T-class modules according to the ITCC rules: accuracy, dynamics and long ranges;

2.4. Scores are points received for participation in the competition in the result table according to the ITCC T-class system;

2.5. Competition calendar is a pre-approved annual competition plan.

2.6. The shooter's ranking is the sum of the best ranking scores obtained by the shooter for participation in at least 4 (four) of any standard competitions in which he (she) participated in the current year;

2.7. Ranking scores received for participation in one competition is the number of final scores in the result table in the T-class system;

2.8. Ranking table is a summary table of the first 10 shooters of the FSKR, which is published on the official website of the FSKR.

## 3. Order of calculation of ranking scores.

3.1. The results of standard competitions held by the FSKR according to the "Calendar of competitions" are accepted in the ranking;

3.2. Any shooter participating in the competition automatically becomes a participant in the ranking;

3.3. The ranking is based on a list of the first 10 shooters taking part in the competition to compare their results with each other;

3.4. The ranking of athletes is reflected in the Ranking Table, which is a list of shooters arranged in descending order, depending on the number of points scored in standard competitions. The ranking is calculated and published on the FSKR website.

## 4. Order of calculation of ranking scores

4.1. The shooter must take part in at least 4 of any standard competitions per year, of which two competitions must be held at different shooting ranges. If the shooter took part in more than 4 competitions, his (her) best four results are taken into the ranking.

4.2. The shooter must shoot all the events of the competition in which he (she) takes part;

4.3. Ranking scores for the best 4 competitions are summed up;

4.4. The best shooter is the one who scores the maximum number of ranking points;

## 5. Winners and awards

5.1. The winners are determined in January of the year following the reporting year. They are the first five shooters with the maximum scores. Additionally, the second 5 (five) of the FSKR shooters from 6th to 10th places are noted according to the table.
